Dear parents/carers,

We have had another brilliant week in school, with number today being the highlight of the week. We have seen some fantastic costumes for Maths Number Day today. Thank you very much for the donations towards the NSPCC today.

In **Little Gems** they enjoyed creating symmetrical butterflies, with symmetrical patterns. Next, they enjoyed playing a numbers game with dice. The children enjoyed rolling the dice, then circling the correct amount of spots on a large piece of paper. They also made some stars from triangles. What a fun day!

In **Opal class** the children measured their shoe size, then put them into order to create a class number line. Opal class also really enjoyed investigating the number of different coloured smarties in a tube. They created physical bar charts, using the smarties, to show the different colours inside the tube. They also enjoyed doing some maths songs with lots of fun actions. Great practical maths Opal class.

In **Jade class** the children have had a brilliant day investigating toothpaste. They completed a practical Venn diagram to see how often the people in their family brush their teeth. Next, emptied and measured how much toothpaste is in a tube of toothpaste and calculated how long it would last. Finally, they created an app to calculate how often you need to buy a new tube of toothpaste and what it would cost. What a fun day!

In **Moonstone class** we have been thinking about significant mathematicians. We looked at the German mathematician Ferdinand Mobius. We investigated how mobius strips change, with the different amount of turns in them. They were amazed at how cutting the paper in half, created one large circle or two interlocking ones. We then looked at M. C. Escher and investigated the different shapes behind his tessellations. We created our own tessellating art pictures, they were very impressive. Finally we looked at Fibonacci and the

Fibonacci sequence, we talked about where it appears in the natural world as well as in mathematical sequences.


