5. Little Gems - Christmas decorations, making Christmas cards and decorations for the tree.

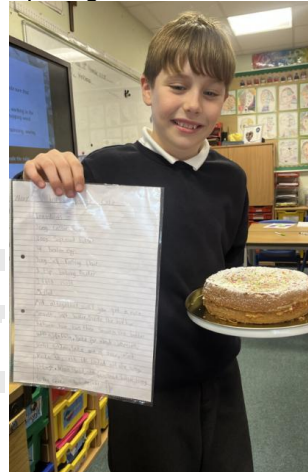
